

And finally, the Preliminary Final in Elizabeth. It wasn't quite the ending we envisioned, going down by 40 points to the eventual Premiers, but it had its own sweet moment. Our retiring captain, Alison Ferrall, scoring a goal as the final siren sounded will remain my most cherished memory of the season. Some might find it strange to see a team that just lost a Preliminary Final celebrating at the siren, but that's a testament to the love the group had for their captain, and they love they have for each other.

Ferrall and Tesharna Maher played their 50th SANFLW games throughout the season, with Ferrall retiring following the Preliminary Final after 57 matches across six seasons. Both the Senior Women's and Men's teams wore guernseys designed by Maher in their respective First Nations Rounds matches. Thirteen players made their SANFLW debuts, eight players represented their State across U16, U18 and U23 level, three players (Tahlita Buethke, Tesharna Maher, Lana Schwerdt) made the team of the year, and two players were drafted into the AFLW – Georgie Jaques and Molly Brooksby.

Norwood's Development League squad also had a strong season, winning all seven home and away matches to qualify for the Grand Final, which was held at Norwood Oval against South Adelaide. Unfortunately the Panthers won the Premiership by seven points.

PATHWAYS

U18 SQUAD

U18 Coach - Alex Newell

The U18 program for 2023 had a completely new coaching panel, led by new head coach Alex Newell. The season presented some initial challenges with the introduction of Gather Round prohibiting the U18 program to train at Norwood, resulting in a nomadic pre-season bouncing around our local zone, which only galvanised the group as the season got closer to commencing. The season began down at Noarlunga against eventual Premiers South Adelaide, which resulted in a come from behind one point win where a lot of those traits formed in the pre-season showed. At the halfway point of the season the side was 6-3 as the Adelaide College Football season began, presenting a new challenge with half of the squad becoming unavailable. However, this provided some new opportunities for others. Despite the season ledger finishing at 7-11, the season produced some development successes. The program consisted of four State representees - Logan Evans & Alex van Wyk (SA), Will Rowlands (Allies) & Orlando Turner (Allies) and produced four players who played senior football in the Reserves and one in the League side throughout the year. Will Rowlands was drafted at the end of the year by the Gold Coast Suns. A year of challenges both on and off the field that resulted in some great development and great comradery that will continue to transcend through the Club.

U16 SQUAD

U16 Coach & Talent Manager - Craig Roberts

In 2023, the U16 squad was into the second year of a full 18-game season, having only played seven-game seasons up until 2021. There are plenty of positives of having a full season, but our demographic also means many challenges. The challenge comes as the Adelaide College Football season commences, and our squad gets hit hard. We used over 70 players across 18 matches in season 2023; this included 20 players from our Eyre Peninsula zone, and 15 from Norwood's U15 side. We also introduced players from Mildura, Broken Hill, and Tasmania. The highlight of the year was defeating eventual Premiers Central District in Round 16 when both sides were at full strength. It shows that our U16 squad has the talent to compete with the best, but struggles with continuity – finishing with a win-loss record of 5-13. This will be my last year as U16 coach (with Chris Slattery appointed U16 coach in 2024), and I have really enjoyed every part of the role. I look forward to watching Chris take the role on with enthusiasm, and I will continue to play my part from the Talent Manager role.

U15 METRO & COUNTRY CHAMPIONSHIPS 2023

In season 2023 we had two sides represent the Norwood Football Club in the July school holidays as part of the State U15 Championships. Both teams showed a competitive nature and competed hard over the three-day carnival, the metro side was coached by Aaron Jelfs and the country team by Michael Curtis. These Championships gave us a great opportunity to see where our players will be in six months when many of them will represent Norwood at U16 SANFL level. The players had the opportunity to hear from Norwood Junior and current Adelaide Crow Max Michalanney. He spoke about the importance of our programs and what the Norwood Junior program did for him to make a fast transition into AFL life.

U13/U14 DEVELOPMENT SQUADS

Our Development Squad players were very lucky to have two senior players as their coaches in 2023, with Declan Hamilton (U13s) and Harry Boyd (U14s) leading the programs. The squads were cut down to 35 players, and from there they attended one training session per week and played five matches. This year we started introducing some Eyre Peninsula players to help the regional players transition into a SANFL football program. In 2024 the SANFL is introducing a new U14 season to be held in February-March. The focus on this squad will be to start introducing the players to the requirements and commitment at the SANFL

level. We also had a big focus on the players starting to understand the culture of our Football Club.

WHEELCHAIR

Captain - Grant Leonard

To sum up 2023 in a line, "Not where we wanted to finish, but definitely on the up".

The SANFL Novita 2023 Wheelchair Football season began with the introduction of the points classification system. This system ensures teams cannot field more than two able-bodied players on field (court) at once, and a maximum team value of 16 points is allowed on court at any one time. Able-bodied players are worth five points; players with the greatest disabilities are worth one point. This brought a tighter competition across the four teams in the League.

David Gould took role as coach this season while also playing, Brodie Healy was assistant coach after crossing over to Norwood from Centrals. Darren Schutz joined Norwood this season from Woodville-West Torrens and was a handy addition to our midfield and defence. Rick Leonard also joined this season with no prior Wheelchair Football experience. Learning multiple positions and gaining experience to wheelchair skills this season will prove very beneficial in the upcoming season.

We were able to take positives away from many of the nine games throughout season, with some very close games lost within the final minutes. We had a draw and even a couple of matches where we won three quarters of the game however still lost. At the end of the season, it really was the third-place play-off final against Central District that really counted for bragging rights. We were up at half time, but just weren't able to get the job done in the last. Woodville-West Torrens were our greatest challenge throughout the year, so we are extremely eager to bridge that gap next season.

We look forward to the 2024 season with some key players joining our side as we endeavour to get back to our winning ways. We are looking forward to having a more consistent side, utilising the full 16 points allowed as per the classification system. Our Reserves side will continue well into next season as well as we strive to increase our depth of players across the two sides.

Norwood had two players in Grant Leonard and Richard Davis that represented SA's State Team for the AFL Wheelchair Championships that were held in Melbourne in November 2023.

FINANCE REPORT

On behalf of the Board and management, I have great pleasure in presenting the Norwood Football Club Incorporated and controlled entities financial report for the year ending 31 October 2023.

FINANCIAL RESULTS

After a successful 2022, both on and off the field, we faced difficulties in 2023. We struggled with increasing costs and the ability to pass those costs on. Cost of goods sold, particularly in the function centre increased significantly, and labour increases were difficult to manage. These are things that we were not alone in dealing with, it has been a challenge for many businesses in Australia. We were able to drive revenue, and having the Wolf Blass Community Centre continues to assist with this. The new oval lighting and boundary side LED ribbon signage are a major attraction for external events in addition to our Club's games. Having these facilities is an important selling point for enticing events, such as the AFL's Gather Round, which was a terrific win for our Club.

The final SANFL Land Divestment received was \$300,000, which is set aside for building works. We received a total of \$2,000,000 over the past eight years.

THE NORWOOD FOOTBALL CLUB INCORPORATED

Attendances at Coopers Stadium in 2023 were steady compared to the previous season, and something we are aiming to improve. We want the game day experience to encourage people to attend, enjoy the entertainment and in return generate valuable income. We continued to improve our facilities and have more to do. Membership was up slightly by 6.9% and we aim to get this number back to 3000 in 2024. Similarly with sponsorship, this was slightly better, being up 5% and we aim to improve this further in 2024. We are in the first full season of the boundary side LED ribbon signage fully functioning and this is helping to entice quality advertising for our sponsors and others.

Merchandise sales for 2023 were \$212,000 compared to \$318,000 in 2022. Premiership merchandise continued to be sold early in the financial year.

THE REDLEGS CLUB INCORPORATED

The performance of our Gaming Venue continues to be strong. Gaming revenue was steady, being up by 1.2%, however food and beverage was up 33% with an improved gross profit margin. We continued to

update the gaming machines and we now have predominantly ticket in, ticket out machines. As stated in previous years the Nor East committee is full of experienced operators helping the Club to provide a terrific facility. The Nor East is important to the football operations and provides critical funds to all junior and senior football teams.

Function income from the Wolf Blass Community Centre ("WBCC") was up 66% from business lunches, general functions and a particularly successful function was when Australian NBA star Josh Giddey was a special guest. An event like this is not possible unless you have a quality function room to hold it within. Beer booth and kiosk sales were up 35% predominantly due to the two AFL games held at Coopers Stadium, which generated significant food and beverage income. It is fantastic that members and supporters are enjoying having on field facilities to utilise. It is important that we have further improvement in 2024, built around successful football performances and continually getting better at managing the venue. The new oval lights do make night football a fantastic experience and we need crowd numbers to increase as a result.

137 THE PARADE TRUST, 581 NORTH EAST TRUST **AND 583 NORTH EAST TRUST**

The Net result of the Trusts was a surplus of \$433,402, an 13% increase compared to the previous year. Rent levels to our tenants increased 10% and interest costs remained low due to very low levels of debt. Debt on these buildings remains at \$16,000, this is critical as interest rates continued to climb. We have the ability to draw down on these loans should the need arise. We expect to see some further increase in rental income in the current financial year. Being able to maximise our return on investment is important and something we spent time on during the year. The surplus is due to the rent collected on the Nor East and rent from the tenants at 581 North East Road. less interest on commercial bills, sundry property maintenance, rates and taxes and other minor sundry items. The surplus is distributed to the Norwood Football Club.

SUMMARY

The Net result of the above entities was a deficit of \$339,127. If we add back depreciation (\$298,574) and remove the net deficit of Build the Fort activities (\$132,695), the result is a surplus of \$92,142.

MEMBERSHIP

In 2023 we grew membership numbers from 2580 in the previous season to 2758, an increase of 6.8%. On a pleasing note, revenue from membership was up 36% from \$350,229 to \$475,153. This is mostly attributable to strong growth across premium categories (Fortis Club and Premiers Club) and our most popular Club memberships. Even more pleasing is that Net Income was up 92% to \$334,060 on the back of consolidating some membership categories and reducing membership pack supplier costs.


The commercial team is working hard to drive membership back above three thousand (last achieved in 2021) with a focus on marketing and win-back campaigns targeting members who have lapsed in the previous five years. The 2024 theme, **Re-Member NOW to Remember MORE in 24** is intended to connect supporters with the great memories they have enjoyed as a Norwood supporter across their lives. Memories like the first game they watched at a packed Norwood Oval or the first Premiership they saw live. We hope the memories cherished by many will stir the passion, light the fire, and convince supporters that have drifted away to return to our great Club, enjoy more memories and sign up as members.

MERCHANDISE

In 2022 we had a strong result with sales up 145% on the previous year to \$317,925 on the back of finals and Premiership merchandise sales. In 2023 with no finals appearance, it was always going to be a stretch to reach such heights. However, if we compare to the previous "non-Premiership" year in 2021, merchandise sales were up 63% to \$212,194 in 2023. It must be pointed out that 2022 Premiership merchandise sales did have a long tail and positively impacted the 2023 figures, however the 2021 sales of \$130,345 did include two finals appearances with strong merchandise sales at both. When looking at the five-year trend for merchandise sales, I am pleased to report that our average growth for this period is 59%. With the daily opening of the Redlegs Merchandise store, the introduction of new merchandise lines and a sustained focus on marketing, I anticipate double-digit growth to continue in 2024.

Importantly our commitment to the EP region is having a positive impact on the local community and we will continue to work with local businesses, invest in the economy and promote the region to our extensive football supporter base.

THE OUTLOOK

Looking forward to season 2024, I am confident that the Club will perform well commercially, continue to grow revenue streams, and provide the best match day experience in the SANFL. I encourage every supporter to buy a membership, buy merchandise, attend functions, and if you can; become a sponsor. We have an amazing community of people at Norwood, if we all contribute 10% more it will make an enormous difference to the commercial bottom line.

Again, thank you to all our loyal partners, members and supporters for your amazing support making the Norwood Football Club family and community the best in the business.

In closing I would like to acknowledge the incredible leadership and support the commercial team receives from our CEO James Fantasia and President Paul Di Iulio. The task of growing commercial operations is made a lot easier when you have a Club that is going from strength to strength both on and off the field under the leadership of James and Paul, and our Board.

2023 saw some consistency return to the functions and events space as clients booked with confidence following an unpredictable few years with the Covid-19 Pandemic.

Whilst the Wolf Blass Community Centre hosted numerous private bookings, events and conferences throughout the year, we had some significant Club highlights along the way, such as:

AFL 'GATHER ROUND'

The AFL arrived at The Parade this season, hosting two official matches as part of the AFL's inaugural 'Gather Round', South Australia's Festival of Footy. In addition to two sell-out games between Fremantle & Gold Coast on Friday evening (April 14), and Hawthorn & Greater Western Sydney on Sunday afternoon (April 16) the club hosted "Captain's Run" training sessions and coaching seminars throughout the week, culminating in an extremely popular afternoon picnic event in the Norwood Memorial Gardens out the front of the Club. Additionally, the Club will enjoy significant long-term benefits from the addition of two custom built coaches boxes and an enclosed commentary box, as well as a newly designed main kiosk enabling the Club to deliver higher volumes of food in shorted times to fans attending the football.

We're extremely excited to be part of an even bigger and better offering next season, with Gather Round confirmed to return to Norwood Oval on April 5 and April 7 in 2024.

AFLW

The Adelaide Football Club kicked off its AFLW season with a sell-out crowd of almost 10,000 people for a home Showdown against Port Adelaide in September – this was the first Showdown held at Norwood Oval and AFLW Showdown 2 overall – followed by two further home and away matches before two home finals at The Parade. While the opportunity to host the Grand Final didn't quite play out as we hoped (with Adelaide losing a Preliminary Final), The Parade benefitted from the Crows positive season with attendances and average spends growing throughout the year, including hosting VIP functions in the Wolf Blass Community Centre for each game during the season.

JOSH GIDDEY DINNER

In June, the Wolf Blass Community Centre welcomed NBA rising star Josh Giddey, as the Football Club partnered with the Norwood Flames Basketball Club to host "An Evening with Josh Giddey". What a success it was. Tickets sold out almost immediately, and a huge crowd turned out in the middle of winter to hear Josh's story of his rise from the Adelaide 36ers to

becoming one of the NBA's and Australian Boomers hottest properties. A hugely competitive auction with some excellent offerings saw a great success for the Club on the evening as Josh left an honorary Redlegs member and many punters happy to have had a photo and contact time with the Oklahoma City Thunder superstar.

APEX SPORTS FESTIVAL

In February, Norwood Oval hosted the third instalment of the APEX Sports Festival – A multi-sport event that included Mixed Martial Arts, Rugby 7's, Medieval Jousting, Strongman competitions and Jiu JitSu taking place on the playing surface throughout an entire day and into the evening. The day finished with a strong crowd to watch the official MMA title bouts and resulted in a positive outcome for the Club.

ANZAC DAY GRAND FINAL REPLAY

Following the Gather Round excitement in April, Norwood hosted the 2022 SANFL Grand Final rematch against North Adelaide at The Parade on Anzac Day. While the result didn't go our way, a great crowd turned out for what would be our highest home game attendance of the season, of just under 4300 people.

PORT LINCOLN & EYRE PENINSULA ROUND

Another big day on the April calendar saw Norwood's SANFL side return to Port Lincoln for the Teakle Cup match against West Adelaide, and while the result this year was unfavourable, the overall trip was again a success for the Club as we continue to grow our supporter base and involvement in the Eyre Peninsula region, the Club's regional zone.


Our final home game of the season saw us partner with local restauranteurs from the Kardachi Group and our Eyre Peninsula partners to supply a feast of Eyre Peninsula produce to a crowd of almost 200 in the Norwood Function Room.

This Round 18 game against Adelaide was the Club's Remembrance Round, where we paid respects to past players and associates of the Club no longer with us we were honoured to host the Lowden family for the day following their son Nick's tragic passing during the season.

In what was a big Round 18 occasion, it was also the Fortis Army Match where Norwood supporters were invited onto the playing surface pre-match to form a guard of honour for the players to run through.

Brady Dawe is regarded as one of the Club's "favourite sons", he commenced his career in 2009 and represented the Norwood Football Club until the end of 2019 season, finishing with 208 matches.

Originally brought into the side as a ruckman it soon became apparent that he had a great flair playing as a tall forward. He was incredibly resilient while playing and rarely missed a game in 10 seasons.

Brady went on to win the Club's Woods Medal in 2015 and received the Garry McIntosh Medal in 2019, but most notedly he's a three-time Premiership player with the Redlegs in 2012, 2013 and 2014.



PAT HALL

Pat Hall joined the Norwood Football Club in 1947 playing in the colts. In 1948 he was playing for the Reserves but by mid-year had made his League debut.

Under Jack Oatey, Hall went on to be one of the League's finest ruckmen/half forwards with a strong mark and reliable kick, he was a member of the 1948 League Premiership team.

At the age of 23, he went to Glenelg. He was playing coach in 1953-1954, vice-captain in 1955 and went on to play 47 games for the Tigers. In 1956 he returned to Norwood.

Pat had a great interest in the game and went on to have a strong influence off the field. This included successful stints as colts coach, pioneer for the Past Players and Officials of the NFC and later became a football commentator on Channel 7 and a radio commentator.

The Hall family is synonymous with the Norwood Football Club with four generations pulling on the guernsey.

He is the grandfather of former Norwood player Joel Patfull, who also played with the Brisbane Lions and GWS. Pat Hall's son John played for Norwood from 1980 to 1991 including the 1984 premiership and his father Alexander played for Norwood from 1928 to 1932.

His life and career in Australian rules football is truly remarkable, and it's clear that he made a significant impact on the sport and the Norwood Football Club.

Pat Hall is a SANFL player life member. His dedication to football and his enduring impact on the sport will be remembered and celebrated for generations to come.

REDLEGS MUSEUM

The Redlegs Museum planning committee, made up of two representatives from each of the Past Players and Officials Committee and the History Committee, along with CEO James Fantasia and Board member Rick Neagle as chair, continued to meet throughout the year. Tom Doull from the practice Architecture That! joined the committee and presented an innovative concept plan to convert the former Mayor's Parlour in the Western Stand into an exhibition space to display images, objects and audio visual material from the Club's historical collection.

Detailed plans for the room which will include interactive elements, a history timeline and a unique locker room, were developed in collaboration with the architect in what promises to be an exciting presentation of the long and colourful history of the Norwood Football Club.

Images of the most outstanding objects in the Club's collection are featured as Museum Treasures on the Redlegs Museum website and include; the first Minute Book from 1878, The inaugural Magarey Medal awarded to Albert Green in 1898, a rare 1907 cap worn by players during games throughout the 19th and early 20th centuries, a 1922 souvenir badge featuring star full forward Roy Bent and the boots worn by Matt Panos when he kicked the winning goal in the 2022 Grand Final.

These, and many other rare and valuable objects from the Club's collection will be displayed for the enjoyment of members, supporters, school groups and the general public when the Redlegs Museum opens in 2024.



2023 GATHER ROUND

The Norwood Football Club seized a remarkable opportunity during the 2023 AFL season when it hosted two AFL matches for Premiership Points as part of the AFL's groundbreaking Gather Round concept.

This innovative initiative aimed to bring the thrill of the game closer to fans by organising all nine Round 5 matches within the state of South Australia. The event unfolded across four days at three different locations – six matches at Adelaide Oval, two at Norwood Oval, and one regional game in the picturesque Adelaide Hills.

Norwood Oval witnessed two exhilarating clashes during this football extravaganza. The first match unfolded on Friday, April 14, featuring Fremantle against Gold Coast in a high-scoring spectacle that saw the Dockers emerge victorious 15.10-100 to 13.12-90. The Sunday afternoon game showcased a nail-biting encounter between Greater Western Sydney and Hawthorn, where the Giants secured a thrilling two-point victory, 10.17-77 to 11.9-75.

Apart from the on field excitement, the concept was driven by the goal of making football more accessible to South Australians and visiting fans. This was achieved through affordable ticket prices and strategically spreading matches across four days in a single city. Notably, Norwood Oval, reminiscent of its crowds from 30 years ago, was brimming with 9329 fans on Friday evening and 9057 attendees on Sunday afternoon, creating a vibrant and nostalgic atmosphere. Both games at The Parade were instant sell-outs.

The precinct around Norwood Oval, particularly the Norwood Memorial Gardens at the southern end were transformed into a lively hub with numerous stalls, bars, live bands, engaging activities, and a large screen for patrons to catch all the action happening on the field. The success of the Gather Round initiative was further underscored when South Australian Premier Peter

Malinauskas announced on Sunday, April 16, that the concept would remain in South Australia for an additional three seasons, affirming its positive impact and popularity among fans. Fast forward to late 2023, and anticipation heightened with the announcement of the 2024 Gather Round fixture. Once again, Norwood Oval was chosen to host two matches: Brisbane versus North Melbourne on Friday, April 5, and Richmond against St Kilda on Sunday, April 7. The continued selection of Norwood Oval underscored its significance as a dynamic venue for premier AFL contests, promising another round of unforgettable moments for fans in the upcoming season.

The occasion has afforded the Norwood Football Club another chance to spotlight its extraordinary venue, and with the backing of the AFL, in collaboration with the Adelaide Oval grounds maintenance team, additional resources were allocated to enhance the oval, ensuring exceptional playing conditions.

The local Norwood Payneham & St Peters Council played a crucial role in the venue's improvement, contributing to the redevelopment of the main canteen area, facilitating more effective and efficient self-serve provisions. Furthermore, supporting the upgrades to the Western Stand included the addition of new coaches boxes and a media center, creating optimal conditions for match officials.

Hosting these matches not only generated supplementary revenues for the Club but also provided a unique opportunity to showcase both the venue and the Club itself. The collaborative efforts of the AFL, Adelaide Oval grounds maintenance team, and local council have not only elevated the overall experience for players and fans with improved facilities but have also solidified the Norwood Football Club's standing as a premier host for top-tier AFL events.




